Duties included maintenance of an average caseload of 65-90 individuals/families, billing 94-144 hours per month (actual range). In addition to maintaining a 'regular' caseload, duties also included rotation as a provider for all emergency services in the region, providing (on average) an additional 20-40 direct emergency service clinical hours. My caseload included individuals of all ages and with various funding sources, or a lack of funding for health care services. Regular provision of clinical supervision services for other licensed clinicians (i.e., case managers and attendant care workers) was also expected. My treatment responsibilities included evaluation services such as routine Law Enforcement Evaluations, Disability Determination Services Evaluations, Neurological Screens/Neuropsychological Evaluations, Competency Evaluations, Custody Evaluations, and Alcohol/Drug (DUI) Evaluations. I have been accustomed to working directly with law enforcement agencies, the judicial district(s), and local and state government. As a clinical provider in the above contexts, I was accustomed to legal testimony. The agency provided comprehensive 24-hour crisis services as part of a State contract and was typically heavily utilized. Emergency services covered a broad geographical area and were typically referred to by local hospitals, law enforcement agencies, other mental health care providers, and private individuals/families. On-call duties were rotated between myself and 8 other master's level and doctoral level licensed providers. In the State of Kansas, all community mental health providers are accustomed to admitting children and adults (voluntarily and involuntarily) to State and private psychiatric units/hospitals.

CLINICAL TRAINING

9/02-9/03 **Rehabilitation Psychology/Neuropsychology Resident- 1500 hours, Good Samaritan Rehabilitation Institute, Phoenix, Arizona.**

Supervisor- Alexander Piatka, Ph.D.

I carried an average caseload of 10-12 patients at any given time. In addition, I saw outpatients and consulted for acute psychiatric patients in the main hospital, as needed. Most of my time was spent with the Rehabilitation Institute. I saw patients with a very wide variety of psychiatric and neurological diagnoses. A common duty within my role involved cognitive capacity and competency assessment.

7/01-7/02 **Psychology Intern- 2000 hours- APA accredited internship Colmery-O'Neil VA Medical Center, Topeka, Kansas.**

In addition to the rotations listed below, I carried an average of 5 psychotherapy cases with individuals and couples, and completed several psychodiagnostic assessments for the MHC. The internship also required attendance of a weekly assessment seminar, bi-weekly psychotherapy and psychology seminars, and routine case presentation by interns. There were many didactic seminars and grand rounds.

1st Rotation-Neuropsychology- Brad Anderson, Ph.D., supervisor.

Completed 28 full neuropsychological batteries and reports during 4-month rotation. Conducted psychotherapy with a low-functioning patient with organic cognitive dysfunction and a history of narcolepsy w/cataplexy, PTSD, chronic substance abuse, bipolar disorder as part of rotation. Stroke group was attended. Routine review of MRI and CT scans with Dr. Anderson was a major part of the training.

2nd Rotation-Geropsychiatry- Roy Nelson, Ph.D., supervisor.

Completed 25 dementia/cognitive capacity assessments during rotation. Co-lead dementia and stroke group twice per week as part of the rotation and long-term psychotherapy case with a multi-infarct dementia patient. The rotation involved 4 team meetings per week that include case review of all geropsychiatry inpatients with entire team present, including psychologist, physician, all RN's, occupational therapist, recreational therapist, dietician, psychology intern, and medical resident.

3rd Rotation-Inpatient PTSD (4/1-7/26/01)- Jonathan Farrell-Higgins, Ph.D., supervisor. A heavy PTSD treatment and assessment rotation involving 9 hours of group therapy per week with intern co-

leading psychotherapy and trauma groups. Conducting psychodiagnostic and neuropsychological assessments, and attending all ward activities and team meetings was a heavy component to the rotation.
